



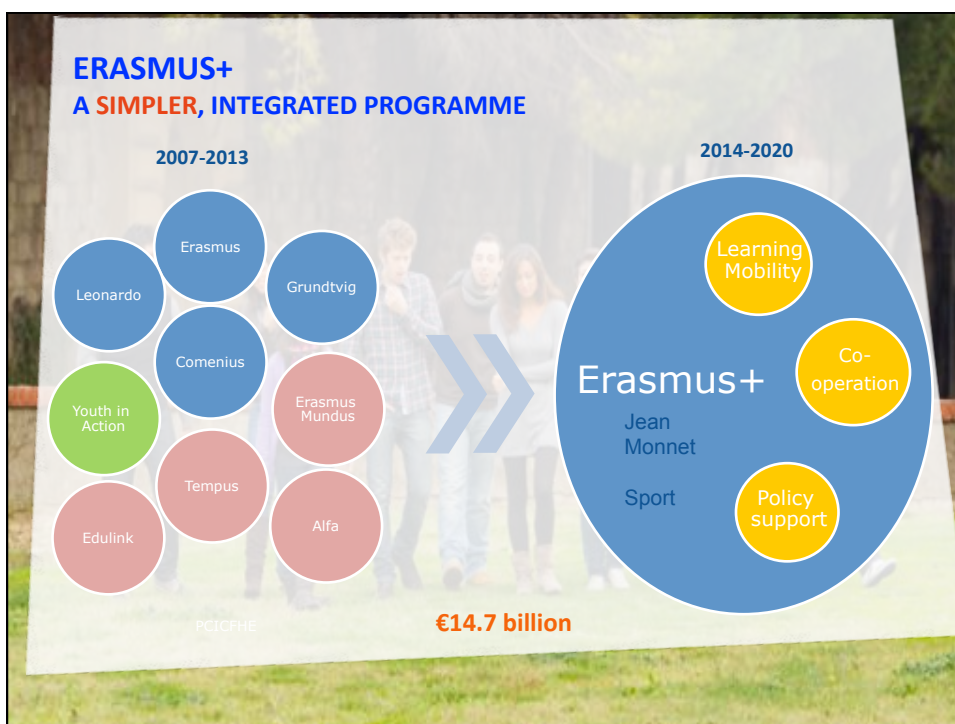



HE student mobility target by 2020 20%

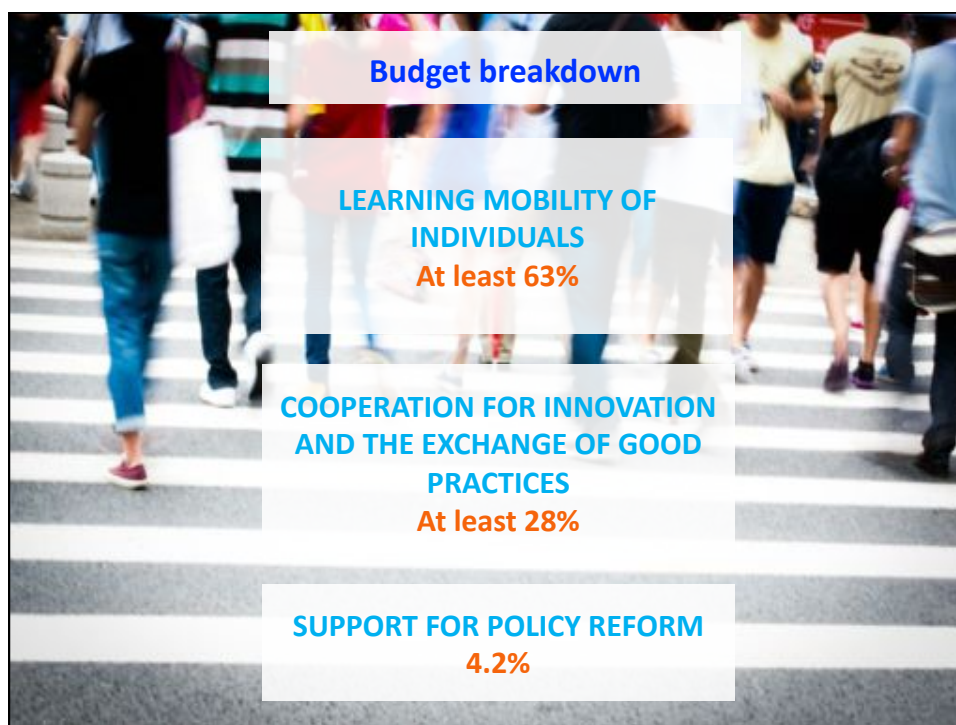

 - Education, training & youth systems

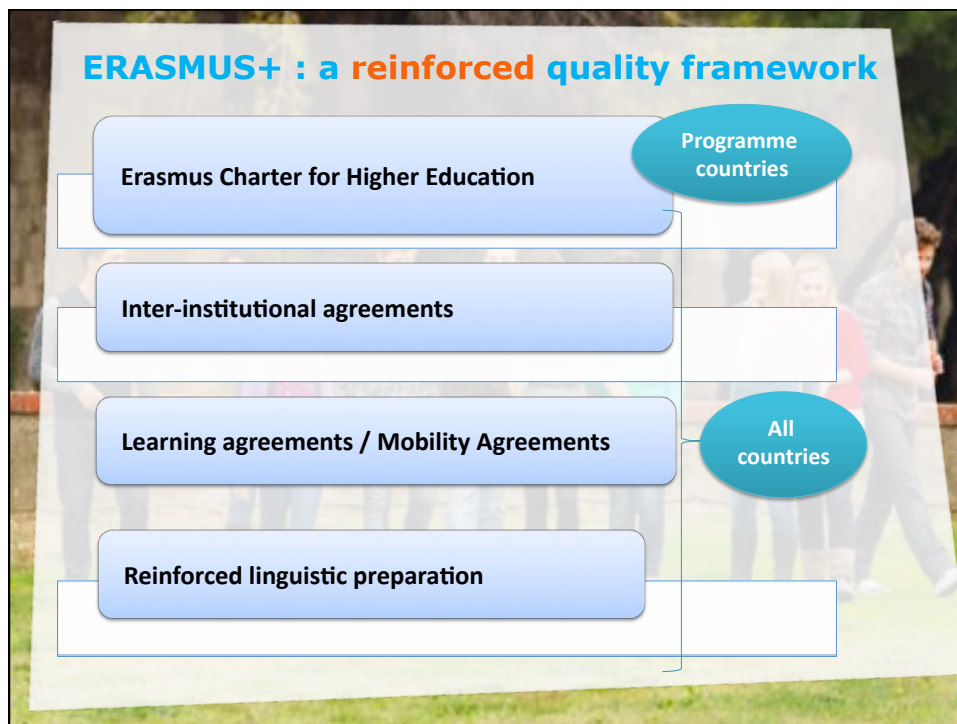

ERASMUS+ : Learning Agreements



- ❖ **Emphasis on the thorough preparation of the mobility by including:**
 - ❖ all the educational components for the future recognition
 - ❖ required language competence of the student
- ❖ **The objective: to ensure that the student receives the recognition for the studies/traineeship abroad**




