ECTS-MA WORKPACKAGE

Toolkit to promote openness and mobility in medical education and training in Europe

The training of future medical doctors must meet the needs in the society.

Openness and mobility of ideas and people in medical education and training in Europe are crucial to embrace new trends, promote quality improvement and accelerate harmonization.

ECTS (European Credit Transfer System) is one of the instruments created by the EU to facilitate this.

This work package will develop a toolkit to assist and coach medical faculties into proper implementation of ECTS in the life long learning in medicine.

Tool Kit

The toolkit will link up and connect learning communities of students, teachers and administrative staff in networks within medical education in Europe.

This will be accomplished through personal contact, web technology and promotion material to offer information and best practice principles.

The goal is to have ECTS implemented in at least 70% of Medical Faculties in EU by 2012 and to increase student mobility by at least 10% within this period.

Action Lines and Deliverables

- **Identical ECTS/Mobility posters.**
- **An interactive web site for students, administrators and academics.**
- **Pilot personal training group visits to selected universities to meet faculty leaders, academics and administrators.**

Action Lines and Deliverables

- **Annual meetings.**
- **International ECTS schools organized in conjunction with the annual meeting.**
- **An interactive database in order to survey the evolution of European medical mobility.**
